The Dieringers have been assigned to carry out their Wycliffe ministry with the Mwotlap language community of Mota Lava, a remote island in northern Vanuatu.

family home. Work
commenced in June,
July and August. It
wasn't too long
before a real
transformation of the



derelict structure took place. Ian was ably assisted with helpers from Australia, Hawaii, and Canada. While there is still plenty left to do, much

was accomplished. As with most of our work, there have been complications with shipping materials but generally work has continued smoothly.





Building in Remote areas!

Instead of starting a whole new house build, we were able to use an existing (quite derelict structure). Once clearing of the land around the old house was complete, the house extension was set out and then sand and coral was carted for the footings. We began by removing the old roof, digging new footings for the proposed extension of the house, pulling out old windows (salvaging glass louvres where we could). Then it was time for new foundations, new timber framing and new roofing (including fascia, spouting and sheets of iron). We made new window and door openings, fitted window frames, covered the new exterior sections with bamboo sheeting and repainted the old external walls. Inside we hung cement sheeting that was painted by our team. Electrical wiring and Wiring for the solar system was done.























Plumbing rough in, septic system, cabinetry and wall & floor tiling will be completed in August/September.
